High Street parking – the saga continues!

We reported on the proposed changes to parking in the village in our last two editions, and the resulting online petition to oppose the changes has over 3,000 signatures, with more still on a paper petition.

The changes proposed by Dacorum Borough Council (DBC) involve parking charges and restrictions in the High Street, and time restrictions in the car parks in Langley Hill and The Nap. Currently parking is free for 1 hr on the High Street with no return within 2 hours (between 08:30 and 18:30) and the car parks are free all day.

The proposals will affect footfall to the small businesses along the High Street and in turn could see these businesses struggling to stay afloat. In addition those who work in the High Street will have very limited options to park, forcing cars into residential streets, causing congestion and unnecessary upset.

There is an issue today with long term parkers on the High Street, which the current restrictions should deter, but without adequate enforcement in place this is a problem. The more complex future scheme would equally have no impact without (costly) manpower to enforce it.

Residents and business owners in the village say they are not against

restrictions or even charging per se. However, a more sensible approach would be to have a grace period of (say) 30 – 60 minutes of free parking for those shoppers just stopping for one or two items, followed by a chargeable period which would allow for longer stops for a coffee with friends, a meal, or a beauty or fitness appointment – ie. more than 1 hour!

The plan was to have a consultation period throughout May allowing everyone in the village to have their say; however following a presentation made to DBC Cabinet by village business owners, and then discussion with Parish Council representatives on 30 April, DBC have suggested some changes to their original proposal. This includes relaxing the time restrictions on Langley Hill car park, but introducing charges there as well, which would allow for all day parking. They insist that their main proposals for charging on the High Street remain in the scheme.

# Jeanette Hayter: 'A life well lived' Village Garden gets

Tributes have been paid to Jeanette Hayter, a well known member of Kings Langley's GirlGuiding community, who has died at the age of 73.

Born and raised in London, in her youth Jeanette was a keen member of the Brownies, Guides and various youth groups, as well as the Baptist Church – passions she carried throughout her life.

She trained to be a dental nurse at Chiswick Polytechnic – during which time she met husband Mick – and then trained as a hygienist and continued with this as her career in Kings Langley and then Berkhamsted after they moved here.

After moving to Kings Langley Jeanette became a 'Tawny Owl' with the Brownies for 30 years and, together with Mick, was renowned for her hospitality, welcoming individuals and groups including young people from Christ Church Baptist where they were in membership for over 51 years.

The couple lived at first in Scatterdells Lane, Chipperfield and then moved to Coniston Road where they had 26 very happy years, welcoming children Sally and Ian in the 1970s and later her 'treasured' grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Service ran through every aspect of Jeanette's life. She was closely

involved in Christian Aid for 50 years and, as a committee member, helped to organise the 'House to House' collection and a number of catering events including light lunches, the Over-60s club, the Village Quiz, and the Church Coffee Shop's infamous coffee and walnut cake.

She and Mick also helped collect and distribute food to refugees as part of the Watford and Three Rivers Refugee Partnership.

Sadly, Jeanette began to be affected by dementia in 2019 and this restricted what

she could do, but with Mick's support she continued to play a part in many of these activities until her death on 25 February 2024.

At Jeanette's Committal and Thanksgiving service on 22 March Mick said that her faith underpinned all that she did, saying 'It's been my joy and privilege to be married to Jeanette and share so many happy memories. None of us know for certain what happens when we die, but I hope and pray that I will join Jeannette in one of the many rooms, probably the kitchen, in our Lords' house.'

The family are very grateful for the many cards received and the donations to Christian Aid in Jeanette's memory, amounting to £5,000 at present.

### Village Garden gets a boost with major planting session

The Village Garden has been receiving a regular injection of planting at least once or twice a year for the last eight years, but still there is room for more.

This year has been particularly challenging with some seemingly never-ending spells of rain. Great for the plants but also great for the weeds.

A small team finally managed to get into the garden recently for a concerted effort to ensure the new planting could take place. Once again thanks must go to a local plantsman who provided 85 healthy specimens for our volunteer gardeners to plant out.

The predominant colours of the plants this year are blue and white, but there was sufficient variety to ensure a marvellous display across the seasons.

The intention is to maintain the garden's peace and tranquillity for visitors, including a small number of secluded areas around the circular path, but to 'layer' the perimeter planting to allow more light into the garden itself.

Councillor Alan Johnson said 'We have also deliberately 'opened up' some areas in the Village Garden to provide views of the church and church grounds for those passing by.'



### Lonely and in need of help?

### KLFC launches Walking Football sessions

A Walking Football group for the over-50s has been set up by Kings Langley FC to help promote fitness and socialising to a broader range of people.

Dean Wigzell, head of community engagement at KLFC, said 'With the largest age distribution of the village population falling within the 50 – 59 bracket we were keen to ensure that the club's activities and initiatives weren't just directed at youth players – of which we have around 500 next season – and those who play semi-professional football for our first team. With walking football having a bit of a boom at the moment it felt like a great opportunity for us to extend our offer.'

Anyone over 50, men and women, are welcome to join the sessions which take place from 9 – 10pm on Monday evenings at Kings Langley School. Each session costs around £5.


New players are always welcome and



# Thousands raised in Mayor's Breaking Boundaries walk

Kings Langley was the final stop of a 105km walk by Mayor of Dacorum William Allen at the start of April, that raised nearly £6,000 for charity.

The Breaking Boundaries Sponsored Walk was held in aid of the Mayor's Future Fund and saw Mayor Allen walk the boundary of the borough, travelling through 16 towns, villages and communities.

The event concluded in an afternoon evensong service at All Saints Church.

The Mayor was joined by nearly 50 supporters throughout the walk, including The High Sheriff of Hertfordshire, and Cllr Robin Bromham, who was by his side for the duration.

The Mayor's Future Fund aims to provide prompt, targeted grants to help community groups in Dacorum achieve a positive sustainable future for residents, with a particular focus on initiatives that may not find financial assistance elsewhere.

Money raised will go towards schemes such as food banks, a support group that assists the elderly in getting to hospital appointments, and a youth club that provides a safe space and hot meal to vulnerable young people.

Four fundraising events took place along the way, attended by more than 220 people, and over 20 community groups, churches, charities and Scout groups participated, including Holy Trinity, Leverstock Green, Flamstead Wish Tree Fundraiser, Swan Youth Project, Sunnyside Rural Trust and 1st Apsley Scout Group

After the walk Mayor Allen took to social media to pay tribute to those who kept him company, his 'doppelganger' Cllr Bromham, and his 'magnificent' wife, Annie.

Residents are being encouraged to sign up to Herts Connected, the new scheme created to replace the OWL messaging system, so that Kings Langley can retain its Village Neighbourhood Watch status.

The village gained qualification as a Neighbourhood Watch village back in 2012 when local volunteers worked together with Herts Police officers to recruit enough Neighbourhood Watch members to have an active scheme in every road across the Parish.

But in order to retain the status as many residents as possible must join the new system so they can continue to receive local and relevant messages from the police and other partners.

In the last year there have been seven burglaries and three attempted burglaries in Kings Langley but by staying informed of local crimes it's thought residents are more likely to take steps to secure their property.

Police messaging also informs people about telephone and online scams so that they are less likely to become a victim of crime; losing money or your identity online or by telephone frauds is likely to be more expensive and intrusive than being burgled.


